Course Closures: MountainView is currently closed for aerification and maintenance until June 19th, and the Preserve will be closed from June 26th to the 17th of July.

Marking your ball on the green: Marking the ball is a courtesy for your partners but is also something that may be required. Rule 15.3 b. addresses this as such: A golfer may require another player to mark the spot of the ball and lift it if:

- It might interfere with the player's stance or intended swing
- Is on or close to the player's line of play, and there is a reasonable chance the player's ball could hit that ball. OR
- Is close enough to distract the player in making the stroke.

So, if someone ask you to mark your ball, please do. With your permission they can mark your ball for you. In stroke play, you may choose to putt first instead of marking your ball.

PRESERVE HOLES 5, 7, 10 and 15:

The drop zones for these holes may NOT be used on your tee shot. On whichever subsequent shot that you are intending to clear the hazard area (not laying up), if your ball lands in that hazard area, you may can use the drop zone. (and incur a 1 stroke penalty)
